DSA-QAG NMH Study Skills Membership Criteria

Candidates for **Associate Membership** should normally have a Level 5 or Level 7 Dyslexia/SpLD specialist teaching certificate. However, for DSA-QAG Non-Medical Helper registration as **a specialist one-to-one study skills support (SpLD) tutor** we may accept applications on an APEL basis.

Our route to APEL membership is as follows:

We look for the following:

- 1. Normally 5+ years of student support experience with a relevant DSA_QAG registered employer (university, college or specialist support service).
- 2. **PLUS** relevant qualifications as a minimum:
 - Degree plus teaching qualification (normally QTLS or equivalent) but we expect additional higher qualifications will have been taken or engaged in.
- PLUS relevant qualifications in the field of student support:
 e.g. other accredited dyslexia/SpLD qualifications, Open University E801, coaching, mentoring, mental health support, etc.
- 4. **PLUS** relevant and ongoing evidence of continuing professional development in the field of dyslexia/SpLD: eg Dyslexia Action, ADSHE, Patoss or in-house development and training programmes.

Where candidates are accepted on this route they are required to evidence on an annual basis a regular and ongoing commitment to CPD in the field of dyslexia/SpLD following membership. We suggest a minimum of 30 hours of CPD per annum and promote our own CPD units however alternative and appropriate evidence (eg in-house training programmes) will be considered.

Some candidates who are lacking in areas 3 and 4 above will be asked to undertake further appropriate training prior to registering with us or as part of their ongoing CPD. They will be referred to the following qualifications:

Level 5 Certificate in Supporting Adults with Dyslexia and Co-occurring Difficulties (DACRT56)

which is made up of two Awards comprising three units, each unit being 30 hours of learning time:

- Level 5 Award in Supporting Adults with Dyslexia and Co-occurring Difficulties (DAAWD59)
 - o DACPD91 Supporting Adults with Dyslexia and Co-occurring Difficulties
 - o DACPD92 Supporting Study Skills in Adults with Dyslexia
 - o DACPD96 Developing Literacy Skills with Assistive Technology
- Level 5 Award in Learning Support for Adults with Dyslexia (DAAWD60)
 - DACPD52 Supporting Individuals with Memory Weaknesses
 - DACPD93 Developing Writing Skills in Adults with Dyslexia
 - o DACPD94 Dyslexia in Multilingual Settings

The Certificate (DACRT56) forms the first part of a <u>Level 5 Diploma</u> leading to a specialist teaching qualification.

How to apply

- 1. Email a copy of your degree and any SpLD relevant qualification certificates and a CV outlining your experience and qualifications to guild@dyslexiaaction.org.uk please allow up to 5 working days for a response
- 2. We will then determine whether or not you can receive the letters ADG or ADG FE/HE after your name to qualify for this of level of membership
- 3. When you have received confirmation of your eligibility from The Dyslexia Guild you should register for UK Guild Membership at £72 plus VAT (£62 direct debit) online
