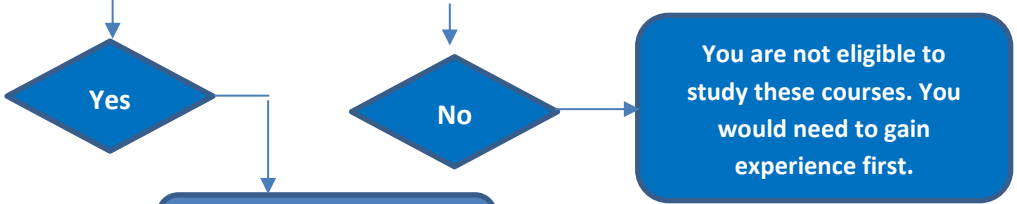


Which SpLD Teaching programme should I choose Level 5 or Level 7?

Do you have at LEAST two years recent and relevant teaching or learning support experience in a dyslexia/literacy support setting?



Do you have a Degree?

Do you have 20 hours a week to commit to commit to a Master's level course?

Do you have up to 10 hours a week to commit to study?

Do you have 3-5 hours a week to study?

The Level 7 Professional Certificate in Structured Teaching Intervention

Choose this route if:

- You are looking for a course that offers University credits and wish to work towards an MA.
- Awards 60 University credits at level 7
- Three modules A, B & C
- Eligible for ADG [Dyslexia Guild](#)
- Eligible for ATS/APS BDA

The Level 5 Strategic Teaching Diploma FAST TRACK route DADIP61

Choose this route if:

- You are looking for a less intensive course and do not require University credits.
- One Award – [Focal Points for Literacy \(DAAWD80\)](#)
- One Certificate – [Strategic Teaching Supporting \(DACRT60\)](#)
- Eligible for ADG [Dyslexia Guild](#)
- Eligible for ATS/APS BDA
- Please note you do not have to complete the level 5 Diploma **before** the level 7 Certificate if you meet the level 7 entry requirements outright

The Level 5 Strategic Teaching Diploma Pathway route DADIP61

Choose this route if:

- You require a more flexible route and can commit to 3-5 hours a week for the CPD Pathway ([DACRT51](#) or [DACRT56](#) or [DACRT67](#)) and 10 hours a week for the specialist teaching programme ([DACRT60](#))
- Eligible for ADG [Dyslexia Guild](#)
- Eligible for ATS/APS BDA

Level 7 Professional Certificate in Assessment Practice
