

Finding out more about Dyslexia and specific learning difficulties

First Steps for Students and Parents

Before seeking an external assessment or tutor, start with your educational institution:

- College and University Students: Contact your Student Support Services first
- School or Sixth Form Parents: Contact the school's Learning Support, SEND, or SENCo first

DSA Report Requirements

For assessment reports to be accepted for a Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA), the assessor must:

- Hold a current SpLD APC and follow <u>SASC guidelines</u> or
- Be <u>HCPC registered</u> at the time of the assessment

You can verify an assessor's APC status on the SASC website.

When hiring an assessor, always ask about their qualifications, you may want to verify that they hold a current <u>Assessment Practising Certificate (APC)</u>.
